Ray Pfortner Workshop — Image Transfer to beeswax

Ray Pfortner of Vashon presented an awesome workshop on transferring images of your artwork to beeswax, at the Cove, for A.U. Members, on July 2.

The process involves applying melted beeswax medium to a prepared surface (or to unfinished marble, stone, or the like.) Then a laser print image (black and white or color) is pressed to the surface. Later the paper is removed by rubbing gently with wet fingers. Voila!
